

'Happy Home' is an initiative of 'Almighty God Ministries' at Tiruvannamalai. With the help of God, I founded Almighty God Ministries in 2009. This children's home is operating and serving the impoverished boys of Tiruvannamalai, who are orphaned or semi-orphaned, poor, and broken families. There were 20 boys when it was established. Due to a lack of funds, we reduced this to 11 children, currently with 6 staff. These precious boys are enrolled in a Christian school in Tiruvannamalai. We provide healthy food, accommodations in a clean environment, medical care, and free transport between Happy Home and school. There is a significant likelihood in that city that young boys from impoverished, underprivileged and broken families could pursue a path involving criminal activities such as becoming a gangster, drug dealer, pimp, or thief, which could potentially lead to his incarceration. I hold a firm conviction that Happy Home not only enhances quality of life, but also aids in diminishing the number of vulnerable, precious young boys who turn detrimental to themselves and others; instead, they are nurtured into aspiring servant-leaders for the times ahead. In the future, I have a vision to start another Happy Home for girls as well.

About me: I am Jebason Frank Samuel, a 35-year-old, who has been in ministry for the past 15 years. I was born into a Christian family, was met with the love of Christ and devoted my life to serving God and people. Having been through numerous struggles myself and having worked with people experiencing unbearable pain and suffering, I have a heart for rescuing those entangled in trials and tribulations and guiding them towards a better life; to educate and encourage them to be the leaders of tomorrow in this broken world.

Why Tiruvannamalai: Tiruvannamalai is an internationally famous Hindu pilgrimage center in South India and is renowned globally for its temples, yoga centers, ashrams, and a holy mountain, which is worshipped as god. This city has a constant influx of visitors and pilgrims from all over the world. However, very few of the locals in this city have even heard the name of Jesus Christ. The city has a population of around 2.5 million of which 98% have never heard about Christ. Moreover, despite the religious nature of this city, it is plagued with poverty, prostitution, child labor, drug abuse, alcoholism, casteism, and gang violence. Persecution of Christians is dangerously high in Tiruvannamalai. The gospel is shared through acts of love and community service.
